

THE BISHOP SPEAKS: "The POWER of the Holy Ghost"

1st Sabbath Sermon, January 20, 2010 [I have seen when] the preacher would say, 'Give me your hand and God your heart. You are saved.' But I came to learn it's more to Salvation than that. When I got sanctified and filled with the Holy Ghost, I came to realize that there is a deeper depth in God. The night I got saved, I prayed until I couldn't hear those around me, and I saw Jesus. He came, took me out of my body and showed me the first, second and third heavens, then he carried me back and put me in my body. I began jumping up, trying to get Jesus to come back and get me, and in the midst [of it all] I received the Holy Ghost (when I came to myself, I was speaking in tongues, as the spirit of GOD gave me utterance). I looked around and saw those who [were apparently] praying with me [the entire time]. I had prayed out of myself. I went home. My wife looked at me and said, 'Oh, Honey! You're glowing.' As I tried to tell her what happened, we both began speaking in tongues. “February 1st, 1960, Greensboro, NC. Four students from North Carolina A&T sit down at a "whites-only" Woolworth's lunch counter and ask to be served. This action by David Richmond, Franklin McCain, Ezell Blair, and Joseph McNeil ignites a wave of student sit-ins and protests that flash like fire across the South [- a] fire for justice that no amount of beatings, jails, or firehouses, can extinguish. Within days sit-ins are occurring in dozens of Southern towns, and in the North supporting picket-lines spring up at Woolworth and Kress stores from New York to San Francisco.”

Civil Rights Movement: 'Brown vs. Board of Education'

“Back in 1951, the NAACP and local parents and community groups began filing lawsuits against school segregation in various parts of the country as described in NAACP Builds the Case. In December of 1952, the United States Supreme Court consolidates 5 of the school desegregation cases under the name *Brown v Board of Education* (see Students and Parents Challenge School Segregation). On May 17, 1954, Chief Justice Earl Warren reads the decision of the unanimous Court:

‘We come then to the question presented: Does segregation of children in public schools solely on the basis of race, even though the physical facilities and other "tangible" factors may be equal, deprive the children of the minority group of equal educational opportunities? We believe that it does...We conclude that in the field of public education the doctrine of 'separate but equal' has no place. Separate educational facilities are inherently unequal. Therefore, we hold that the plaintiffs and others similarly situated for whom the actions have been brought are, by reason of the segregation complained of, deprived of the equal protection of the laws guaranteed by the Fourteenth Amendment.’

The Supreme Court [...]mandates the desegregation of schools across America.”
